This is one of the requirements for ensuring that testing environments are isolated from production environments.

Explanation

all network transmissions must be logged by an entity's security information and event management (SIEM) system or equivalent tool, which means they should record all network events and activities related to cardholder data processing and transmission. This is one of the requirements for ensuring that network transmissions are monitored and audited.

Explanation

An LDAP server is a type of directory service that provides authentication and authorization data to the cardholder data environment (CDE)¹. According to the PCI DSS scoping and segmentation guidance², any system that provides a security service to the CDE, such as authentication, is considered a connected or security-impacting system (Category 2) and is in scope for PCI DSS. This is because such systems can affect the security and controls of the CDE and the cardholder data (CHD) or sensitive authentication data (SAD) that it contains. Therefore, an LDAP server providing authentication services to the CDE is in scope for PCI DSS, regardless of whether it stores, processes, or transmits CHD or SAD, or whether it provides authentication services to systems in the DMZ or not.
